They then drew lots for them, and as the lot fell to Matthias, he was listed as one of the twelve apostles.

It is vital that our three Sunday Masses do not get overcrowded! There is no Sunday obligation to attend Mass. PLEASE, ATTEND CHURCH RESPOSIBLY.

N.B.: The church will be opened 15 mins before the start of Adoration or Mass.

Notes on some parts of Mass

In the celebration of the Holy Mass we have two antiphons: the Entrance Antiphon and the Communion Antiphon. An antiphon in its nature and by the true meaning of the word must be sung. On Sundays, the antiphons are commonly replaced by a hymn (which at the moment is sung by the choir only). So, whenever there is a hymn the antiphons are not sung or recited at all, because it would be a repetition. On weekdays, at the moment, the priest will sing the antiphons at Mass.

Some speak about the important concept of 'Full and Active participation' at Mass. **This is really important!** And this is what the Dogmatic Constitution on Sacred Liturgy, promulgated by the Second Vatican Council states in regards:

"Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people" (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism. In the restoration and promotion of the sacred liturgy." (Sacrosanctum Concilium 14)

Full participation means that we have to participate in the Mass with our whole being, body and soul. We are to be people of integrity, which means that we must not be living a double life, one inside the church and another outside of the church. Hence, we must bring heart and soul in the celebration of the liturgy.

Active participation means that we cannot be viewers in the liturgy. In church we are not as at the theatre or cinema. During the Liturgy of the Word we are called to be attentive listeners following every word is proclaimed by the reader. During the **Eucharistic Prayer** we are called to an active listening where we are to agree to what the priest is praying. The Great *Amen* that we say at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer is the people's **YES** to all that the priest has just prayed to God.

It is important to recite together the common parts of the Mass, loud and clearly. These include: the I Confess, the Gloria, the Alleluia, the Creed, the Sanctus, the Mystery of Faith, the Lord's Prayer, the Agnus Dei and all the other responses.

Regarding the **Gospel Acclamation**, this is divided into *two* parts: the Alleluia and its Verse (Alleluiatic Verse). On one hand, the Alleluia is sung or recited by the whole assembly before and after the Verse. The Verse, on the other hand, is sung by the choir

or read by the reader alone. It is very cacophonic (unpleasant sound) when an antiphon or the Alleluiatic Verse are read by all at the same time.
