When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, ‘Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.’ And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, ‘Son of David, have pity on me.’ Jesus stopped and said, ‘Call him here.’ So they called the blind man. ‘Courage,’ they said ‘get up; he is calling you.’ So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, ‘What do you want me to do for you?’ ‘Rabbuni,’ the blind man said to him ‘Master, let me see again.’ Jesus said to him, ‘Go; your faith has saved you.’ And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

FROM THE CATECHISM THE THIRD COMMANDMENT

Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labour, and do all your work; but the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; in it you shall not do any work. (Ex20:8-10)

The sabbath was made for man, not man for the sabbath; so the Son of Man is Lord even of the sabbath. (Mk 2:27-28)

I. The Sabbath Day

2168 The third commandment of the Decalogue (=Ten Words) recalls the holiness of the sabbath: "The seventh day is a sabbath of solemn rest, holy to the LORD."

2169 In speaking of the sabbath Scripture recalls creation: "For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day and hallowed it." (Ex 20:11)

2170 Scripture also reveals in the Lord's day a memorial of Israel's liberation from bondage in Egypt: "You shall remember that you were a servant in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God brought you out then with mighty hand and outstretched arm; therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day." (Deut 5:15)

2171 God entrusted the sabbath to Israel to keep as a sign of the final covenant. The sabbath is for the Lord, holy and set apart for the praise of God, his work of creation, and his saving actions on behalf of Israel.

2172 God's action is the model for human action. If God "rested and was refreshed" on the seventh day, man too ought to "rest" and should let others, especially the poor, "be refreshed." (Ex 31:17). The sabbath brings everyday work to a halt and provides a respite. It is a day of protest against the servitude of work and the worship of money. (2 Chr 36:21)

2173 The Gospel reports many incidents when Jesus was accused of violating the sabbath law. But Jesus never fails to respect the holiness of this day. (Mk 1:21; Jn 9:16) He gives this law its authentic and authoritative interpretation: "The sabbath was made for man, not man for the sabbath." (Mk 2:27) With compassion, Christ declares the sabbath for doing good rather than harm, for saving life rather than killing. (Mk 3:4) The sabbath is the day of the Lord of mercies and a day to honour God. "The Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath."

O most sweet Jesus, through the bloody sweat which You suffered in the Garden of Gethsemane, have mercy on these Blessed Souls.

R: Have mercy on them, O Lord.

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which You suffered during Your most cruel scourging, have mercy on them. **R.**

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which You suffered in Your painful crowning with thorns, have mercy on them. **R.**

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which You suffered in carrying Your cross to Calvary, have mercy on them. **R.**

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which You suffered during Your most cruel Crucifixion, have mercy on them. **R.**

O most sweet Jesus, through the pains which You suffered in Your most bitter agony on the Cross, have mercy on them. **R.**

O most sweet Jesus, through the immense pain which You suffered in breathing forth Your Blessed Soul, have mercy on them. **R.**

ACN – Mozambique Appeal

Aid to the Church in Need - Love amid the suffering.

"We are running, fleeing, trying to hide here on the shore. They are shooting everywhere. May it be as God wills, here in Palma...The houses have been abandoned."

These were the words of a voice message an unnamed man sent Aid to the Church in Need during an attack in March by more than 150 insurgents on the port town of Palma, northern Mozambique. Since 2017, a militant group called 'Al- Shabaab', with links to Daesh (ISIS), has waged a violent insurgency that has seen children as young as 11 beheaded and churches destroyed.

"They had already attacked and burnt five or six local chapels, they also burnt some mosques. Although ultimately, it seems, the target is the Christian churches." Bishop Luiz Fernando Lisboa.
